Gratitude is a wonderful thing. It's a powerful thing too. Gratitude can lift our spirits. When we are down in the dumps, a bit of gratitude can turn our whole mindset around to something entirely more positive. Fraulein Maria's reminder that when we are low to give attention to a few of our favorite things really was sound advice.

Gratitude prevents bitterness. When we are

grateful for something, we are not going to be focused on all the things we don't like about it. We won't be focused on all the things we aren't happy about either.

Gratitude is a solution for jealousy and envy. When you are grateful for something and, better yet, for someone, you won't be worried about what they might be getting that you aren't. When you know something was given to you, and that you didn't have anything to do with receiving it, you'll be more willing to share it.

Gratitude will even make you better looking. A grateful person tends to smile more than an ungrateful one, and a smile is always more attractive than a frown.

In the context of a church, a spirit of gratitude helps to maintain the unity of the body of Christ. When we are looking for things for which we are grateful, we are not going to be focused on things we don't like or what this or that person did to make us upset. When we are grateful together for the work God is doing in our midst, we are going to be naturally inclined toward seeing more and more of it happen more and more frequently. And when we are moving together in the direction of seeing God's work expand, we are pretty likely to see it expand.

If you'll remember from our series on prayer, gratitude is a major factor in seeing our prayers answered and experiencing the peace of God that passes all understanding.

But here's something about gratitude that is really important to understand: It is directional. That is, gratitude is pointed toward someone for something. You can't just be grateful generally. You are grateful for something and to someone.

Now, the most obvious and important object of our gratitude is God. Yet because He often does His work through other people, our gratitude is

directed first toward them, and then on toward God from there. Do you know who else God does His work through? You. There are times when God does something through you for someone else such that you are the direct object of their gratitude. That's always a fun moment. It feels good to receive gratitude like that because we know we have done something worthwhile and God-honoring for another person.

So then, what if we tried something together as a church? If God's gratitude-prompting grace is often directed to us through other people and to other people through us, what if for the next month we sought to be more intentional about that experience? What if instead of waiting for God to move and happening to be there when He does, we started taking the initiative and looking for opportunities to induce gratitude in our fellow church members? What if we started being intentional about increasing the amount of gratitude flowing through our church body by doing things for one another that are designed to elicit responses of gratitude?

The point is not that we love one another simply to be told "thank you" for what we have done. We do this without seeking any kind of recognition for ourselves. Rather, we look to bless one another in intentional ways that will cause gratitude to well up among us as we go. If you have read this far, I challenge you to do two things. First, write down four things you can do for four people this month that will bless them, prompting a response of gratitude on their part. Then, go and do those things over the course of the month—one per week. Second, if you wind up being on the receiving end of someone else's efforts, share the story of that experience with someone else, emphasizing your gratefulness for the blessing of whatever it was.

Let's work together to foster a great and deeper spirit of gratitude among ourselves, to God's glory, our joy, and the increase in our ability to turn that blessing outward toward our community. Let's be the church that becomes known as the place where gratitude flows in abundance and see just what God does with our efforts.
